Kasper, president and COO of Global Electric Motorcars.

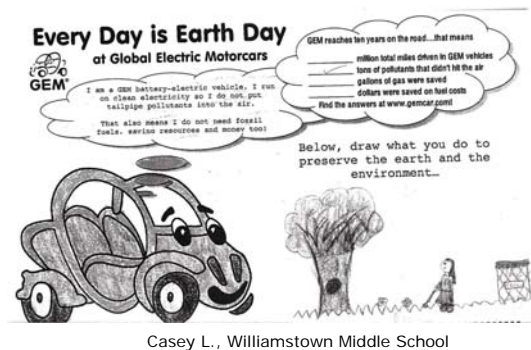
