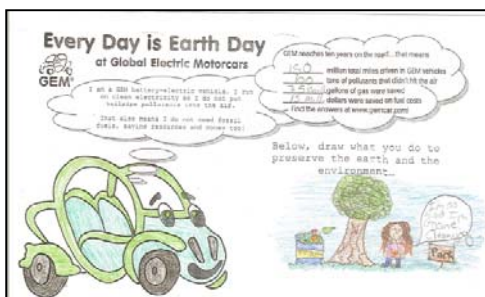

A Chrysler company, Global Electric Motorcars (GEM) has nearly 35,000 neighborhood electric vehicles (NEVs) on the road nationwide being used by individuals, master planned communities, university and corporate campuses, and local, state and national government agencies, among others.

Global Electric Motorcars has been manufacturing street-legal NEVs for 10 years.
